Day 1. CDMX Arrival – Saturday

Upon arrival you'll be receive by a coordinator/guide and he will help you to take your transfer from Mexico City airport to the hotel, free afternoon. Welcome dinner.

Day 2. Guadalupe Shrine & Xochimilco Sunday

Breakfast at the hotel. Group will gather at the lobby to take their bus, today 's tour will start at the Plaza of the three cultures, where the past and the present are mixed, since there are still architectural traces of the Mesoamerican and Spanish colonial period that join the modern architecture of Mexico. Next stop, Our Lady of Guadalupe shrine, patron saint of Mexico and the Americas. After touring the shrine's facilities, the bus will be waiting to take you to the famous Xochimilco canals, the last remains of the extensive transportation system created by the Aztecs, are located in the south of Mexico City, next to a busy working class neighborhood. The colorful gondolas take visitors for rides alongside the boats of

food vendors, artisans and mariachis. Afterwards, return to the hotel. Free night.

Day 3. Ocotlán Shrine – Monday

Breakfast at the hotel. At the appointed hour the group will meet in the lobby to board the bus and leave for Ocotlán, before their arrival there will be a stop at the Church of San Miguel del Milagro, the place owes its name to the legend of the apparition of San Miguel Arcangel in 1631 on the hill of Tzopiloátl near Cacaxtla, after the apparition, the site began to be populated and by 1680 there was already a hermitage and a hostelry for the pilgrims who year after year began to come to visit San Miguel Arcángel. Later they will visit Ocotlán 's Shrine, which was built to obey the command of the Virgin who appeared in 1541 to an indigenous man named Juan Diego Bernardino. Its facade, in a stylish baroque style, presents a rich work of mortar that forms a kind of shell where the Virgin, Saint Francis of Assisi and the seven Archangels preside.

Finally, you will leave for the city of Tlaxcala where you will enjoy a delicious meal. There will be time to walk the streets of Tlaxcala.

Return to Mexico City. Free night.

Day 4. Tulpetlac and Teotihuacán – Tuesday

Breakfast at the hotel. Once again the group will meet early in the lobby to head to the beautiful ruins of Teotihuacan. Before their arrival they will stop at Our Lady of the Remedies shrine, it is said that this figure was brought by Hernan Cortez and it is also said that on the "sad night" the Virgin appeared to Cortez and it is she who urged him to get up and continue with the conquest.

Once you tour the facilities and listen to the guide about the existence of the virgin of the remedies, you will continue to Teotihuacan, where the remains of this great civilization are located. Upon arrival you will tour the ruins of this great civilization. Through the center of the place, which was once a flourishing pre Columbian city, passes the Calzada de los Muertos. This links the Temple of Quetzalcoatl, the Pyramid of the Moon and the Pyramid of the Sun. The last two have panoramic views from their peaks. On your departure you will arrive to eat at a local restaurant.

When you finish your meal you will leave for Tulpetlac, a church built in the area of the fifth apparition of the Virgin of Guadalupe. Finally you will return to the hotel and have a free night.

Day 5. Miguel Pro and Zócalo – Wednesday

Breakfast at the hotel. Today the group will leave for the church of Miguel Pro, who was a Catholic priest, member of the Society of Jesus, accused of participating in acts of sabotage and terrorism, in the context of the Church-State conflict that affected Mexico between 1926 and 1929.

After learning about the life of Miguel Pro, you will continue to the Zócalo of the CDMX where you will visit the Metropolitan Cathedral, the Templo Mayor and finally the National Palace where you will see the murals of Diego Rivera that tells the history of Mexico. You will return to the hotel and have the rest of the day free.

Day 6. Tepotzotlán – Thursday

Breakfast at the hotel. The group will board the bus early to go to Tepotzotlán (pueblo magico), here the group will enter the Viceroyalty Museum, you can also access the Temple of San Francisco Javier and let yourself be enveloped by its baroque architecture and admire the altar carved in gold. There will be time to walk the streets of Tepotzotlán, visit the handicrafts market and have lunch. If time permits we will visit Arcos also known as arches of Xalpa, is a monumental work erected in the viceregal era in the early eighteenth century, by the Jesuit community. Free time.

At the indicated time the body will return to CDMX, free night.

Day 7. Return home – Sunday

Breakfast at the hotel. At the indicated hour you will leave the hotel to the airport to take your flight back home.
